Ald. McCarthy,

The following have occurred on the Broad St Pkway Study over the last two weeks:

- On January 8, the NRPC finalized proposal scoring criteria after incorporating to the best extent possible the requirements of NRO §2-248.
- On January 11, the NRPC received subconsultant proposals from three firms - Rizzo, Louis-Berger, and VHB.
- Also, on January 11, members of the Executive Review Team met as part of a regular session between Community Development and DPW and decided which members will be involved in the NRPC's selection of the subconsultant. Alderman McCarthy had previously mentioned that other commitments will prevent him from being involved in the selection process.
- On January 12, copies of the proposals along with scoring criteria were delivered to four members of the Executive Review Team for review.
- On January 18, the four members were invited by the NRPC to proceed with subconsultant selection. VHB was selected as the best firm to perform the work. The attached draft meeting notes prepared by Tim Roach documents the decision-making process at the 1/18/07 meeting.
- The NRPC has started discussions with VHB and is expected to finalize an agreement, fee and work schedule in the next week or so.
- On January 24, the Executive Review Team transmitted comments to the NRPC on VHB's proposed fee schedule (attached email).
